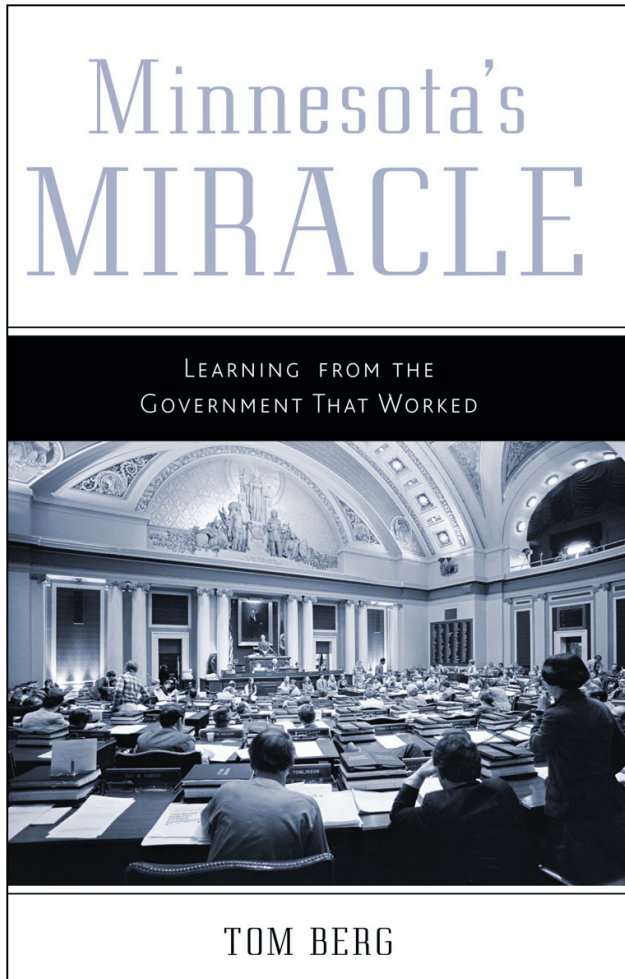

Martin Sabo (DFL) is a former United States Representative for Minnesota's fifth district, Sabo was elected to the Minnesota House of Representatives in 1960 and later served as minority leader (1969-72) and as house speaker (1973-78).. **Briana Bierschbach** (facilitator) is a staff writer and reporter at Politics in Minnesota. She covers the state Capitol, local elections and has won awards for her breaking news. Briana has worked with the Associated Press, Minneapolis/St. Paul Business Journal, The St. Paul Pioneer Press and the Minnesota Daily. **Morrie Lanning** (GOP) served as the mayor of Moorhead for 21 years from 1980-2001. He was elected to the Minnesota House of Representatives in 2002 and served for a decade. Lanning was a member of the House's State and Local Government Operations Reform, Technology and Elections Committee and the Taxes Committee.
